### **Biographical Sketch:**

**Clarence Emile Cannell (“Jack”)** was born on November 8, 1884 in Kamloops, B.C., the son of Edmund James Cannell and Mary A. Lane. He lived in the Noble Creek area and ran a successful sugar beet farm. Clarence Emile Cannell died on February 4, 1963 in Kamloops, B.C. and is buried at the Pleasant Street Cemetery.

### **Scope and Content:**

Fonds consists of the personal papers of Clarence Emile Cannell including correspondence, certificates, essays, maps, family photographs, and ephemera.

### **Custodial History:**

Accession 2000.066 was donated to the Kamloops Museum and Archives on November 30, 2000 by John and Sally Tupholme. The records had been passed down through Sally Tupholme’s (nee Tunstall) family. Accessions 0.2836 and 0.3472 have no donation information available, but were likely accessioned into the collection of the KMA during the 1980s. Accession 1974.043 was donated on August 21, 1974 by Richard Dummett.
