Biographical sketch:

Robert Henry Carson was born on 7 November 1885 at Pavilion, B.C., the son of rancher Robert Carson and Eliza Jane Magee. He was educated in New Westminster and by 1910 had started his professional life in Vancouver working in real estate. He married Constance Mildred Robson, daughter of F.H. Robson, in 1912, and the couple settled in Kamloops. In the 1928 Carson unsuccessfully ran as the Kamloops Liberal party candidate for the Legislative Assembly of British Columbia. He ran a second time as the Kamloops representative in the November 1933 election and won a seat. His political career as MLA for Kamloops spanned the following 16 years and saw Carson appointed Deputy Speaker of the House in 1937 and Speaker of the Legislative Assembly in 1948. Carson was instrumental in founding the Kamloops Real Estate Board and served as the president of the Richmond Point Grey Board of Trade. He died in Kamloops on 8 March 1971.

## Scope and content:

This fonds consists of 15 scrapbooks created by Robert Henry Carson, MLA for Kamloops from 1933 to 1949. The scrapbooks begin in 1935 and document each session of the provincial assembly until he left office in 1949. The scrapbooks are largely comprised of newspaper clippings relating to political topics, though there are also invitations, a small number of government publications and documents, and a single photograph. Many of the scrapbooks include an alphabetical index written by Carson on the first few pages. The fonds also includes Carson's school diplomas and Masonic Order certificate; 4 group photographs of the B.C. Legislative Assembly; and, 1 scrapbook that likely belonged to his wife, Constance Carson, which contains clippings from 1947 to 1963.
