Physical Description: 12 cm of textual records, ca. 60 photographs, and 2 objects

Biographical Sketch:

James Buie Leighton was born on November 8, 1851 in Scotland, the son of James Leighton and Isabella B. Buie. The family moved to California when Leighton was 3 years old so that his father could run the Nevada mine. After the death of James Leighton (senior) in 1863 the family moved to Victoria, B.C. to live with Isabella B. Leighton's brother, Thomas Buie. In 1865 Leighton had moved to Barkerville with his uncle to run a store, before moving to Lytton in 1871 to work as a clerk. In 1881 Leighton won the contract to carry the weekly mail between Cache Creek and Okanagan Landing, via Kamloops, and he chose to settle at the mid-point of these two destinations near Savona. By 1882 he had established a stage and telegraph office at Savona, and was beginning to put down roots. Leighton married Jane Elizabeth Uren on January 19, 1882 in Clinton, B.C., with whom he had 4 sons (Leslie L., Charles Ewen James, Raymond Findlay, and John Bickford Kirkwood) and 2 daughters (Leslie and Enid Evelyn Kathleen). Leighton established a cattle ranch in Savona, and became involved in local society, becoming Cattlemen's Overseer, Fishery Overseer, and Superintendent of the B.C. Express in 1897 and writing many articles for the local newspaper on history. Leighton also spent time working as a telegraph operator, ferryman, and Indian Agent. In 1921 Leighton sold his Savona ranch to Harry Vassey and retired from the ranching industry. James Buie Leighton died on December 2, 1945 in Kamloops, B.C. at the age of 94.

Scope and Content:

Fonds consists of account books, correspondence, personal documents and objects, and family photographs.

Custodial History:

Fonds originally consisted of only accession 1977.011. Accessions 0.2705 and 0.2932 were originally placed in the Vertical Files Collection, but were accrued to this fonds during reprocessing in 2019. Accessions 1977.011 and 0.2932 were donated to the Kamloops Museum and Archives in 1977 by George Bowers (1977.011 per Jean Gordon), and accession 0.2705 was donated at an unknown date by Mrs. J. Manuel.
