Biographical Sketch:

Reverend George Murray was born on June 30, 1844 in Scotland. He was educated at Glasgow University, where he earned an M.A. In the late 1870s Murray emigrated from Glasgow to take up ministry with the Church of Scotland (the Presbyterian Church) and settled in Nicola. Murray was the first Presbyterian minister in the region, and travelled a circuit preaching the Church's message throughout the area. In 1876 he was instrumental in the construction of the Murray Church near Merritt. Murray married Florence McDonald in 1878 in Nicola, with whom he had four sons (Frederick Oberlin, John F. McDonald, George L., and William G.) and four daughters (Christine T., Margaret, Catherine, and Mary K.). In 1880 the family moved to New Glasgow, Nova Scotia so that Murray could preach at the Presbyterian Church there, but the family would return to Nicola in 1889. After two more years of preaching, Murray would retire from the church and take up a post as an Indian Agent with the government. Reverend George Murray died on October 7, 1917 in Vancouver, B.C. at the age of 73.

John F. McDonald Murray was born on September 8, 1882 or 1883 in Nicola, B.C., the son of Reverend George Murray and Florence McDonald. Murray married Maud Ethel Woodward on October 6, 1911, with whom he had at least one daughter (Florence).

Maud Ethel Murray (nee Woodward) was born on August 15, 1880 in Nicola, B.C. the daughter of Harvey Hogan Woodward and Agnes Dunn Rankin. On October 6, 1911 she married John F. McDonald Murray, with whom she had at least one daughter (Florence). Maud Ethel Murray died on May 2, 1974 in Vancouver, B.C. at the age of 93.

Florence Sheret (nee Murray) was the daughter of John F. McDonald Murray and Maud Ethel Woodward.

Scope and Content:

Fonds consists predominantly of family photographs from the Murray and Woodward families. Fonds also includes accompanying photo cards, a copy of *The Chinook Jargon*, a sermon preached by Reverend George Murray, a marriage certificate for John F. McDonald Murray and Ethel Maud Woodward, and an envelope.

Custodial History:

Fonds was donated to the Kamloops Museum and Archives largely by Florence Sheret at various dates: accession 1975.043 (July 3, 1976), accession 1976.022 (June 11, 1976), accession 1977.048 (June 21, 1977), and accession 1978.058 (September 22, 1978). Accession 0.3003 has no available donor information. Accessions 1975.043 and 0.3003 were previously placed in the Vertical Files collection, and accessions 1976.022, 1977.048, and 1978.058 were previously placed in the Photograph collection before being brought together as a distinct collection during reprocessing in 2020.
