Administrative History:

The Soldier's Comfort Club was established in Kamloops in 1915 to send comforts to men from Kamloops and district who were fighting in World War 1. The Club was founded by Mrs. Vicars, and in 1917 Mrs. Winnifred M. Fulton was named President. They worked in partnership with the Red Cross Guild and other aid organizations and had many successes gathering materials to send overseas. The Club was officially disbanded in 1919. The activities of the Club were resumed during World War 2 under the leadership of the Kamloops Civilian Auxiliary.

Scope and Content:

Fonds consists of minute books, reports, lists of members, and correspondence detailing the activities of the Soldier's Comfort Club in Kamloops during World War 1.
